

SIX GOATS AND A LADY

Sally B. Farms owner Wendy McCullough didn’t think much was out of the ordinary when Helen, one of her 40-odd goats, went into labor.

Five kids and two and a half hours later, she was in shock.

Quintuplets are a rarity in the goat world.

Standing in a specially built stall, McCullough surveys the little miracles that happened in her barn as they look for a snack and crowd around Helen, a doe of the La Mancha breed.

“I put Helen in the barn because I knew she was going to have some babies. I checked on her in the evening, and she’d had a baby. I knew there were more coming,” McCullough said.

After the third kid dropped McCullough figured she’d better stick around for awhile. She didn’t interfere with the birthing process because sometimes the mother will reject the kids, which would leave McCullough with extra bottle feeding chores.

Shortly afterward a fourth kid was born and McCullough figured Helen was through as the goat’s sister had dropped four kids the year before.

While placing the fourth kid in a better location so Helen could lick it off, the fifth kid arrived.

“Just like butter,” Mc-

Cullough said with a laugh.

In her years of goat raising McCullough has only had four sets of quadruplets born, and not all of those survived. In Helen’s case, she had four bucks and a doe and all are expected to survive — albeit with a little help, as Helen does not produce enough milk for all five kids.

“I’ve been supplementing

(bottle feeding) them,” McCullough said. She is keeping the supplement to a minimum, again to keep Helen and even the other goats from rejecting them, although two will probably become “bottle babies” regardless. She said that the two will do better together than one because goats are herd animals.

“It’s very unusual, and hav-

ing them all live is very unusual,” McCullough said.

Leaning down to brush a wisp of hay from the back of one of the kids, she looks up and says, “If I lose any of them, it’ll be my fault unless something’s wrong with them.”

Watching McCullough fuss over the new family, that seems like a dim possibility.
