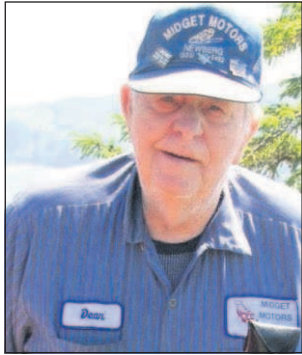


OBITUARIES

Dean Loren Hulse

Dean Loren Hulse passed away at the age of 90 on Feb. 9, 2017 at his home in Newberg, Oregon.



He was born to parents, Herman Hulse and Wilma (Lay) Hulse on Sept. 14, 1926 in Enterprise, Oregon.

He is preceded in death by his parents and his wife Thelma (Powers) Hulse.

He is survived by his three sons Mike (Leslie) of Wallowa, Oregon, Don (Patty) of Newberg, Oregon and Sam (Linda) of Newberg, Oregon; nine grandchildren and 21 great grandchildren.

Dean grew up in Enterprise, Oregon. He joined the U.S. Navy in 1945 and served on the aircraft carrier, U.S.S. Saginaw Bay as an electrician's mate. He was honorably discharged in 1947.

He moved to De Lake, Oregon (now called Lincoln City) in the mid 1940s where he met his sweetheart, Thelma Powers, while home on leave. They were married Sept. 22, 1946.

Dean worked in the woods logging, had his own cedar shake mill and repaired chain saws. He moved his family to Portland, Oregon, in 1964 then, two years later to Newberg, Oregon where he lived until his death.

He loved the Lord and was a member of the Ocean Lake and then Newberg Assembly of God churches. He was part of the volunteer crew that worked on the construction of both churches. He was an avid lover of the outdoors and especially Wallowa County. He enjoyed trout fishing, deer and elk hunting. He was owner/operator of Midget Motors founded in March 1965 in Portland, Oregon. He opened a second store in Newberg in 1967.

This year marks 50 years of serving the community of Newberg and beyond. He will be greatly missed.

A public memorial service will be held at 11 a.m. Saturday, Feb. 25, at Rock Point Church, 4301 N College St, Newberg, Oregon.

Elks announce \$1K scholarship winners

The Enterprise Elks held their annual Most Valuable Student Competition in January and the two first winners are Jacob Evarts and Darby Gasset, from Enterprise High School.

Each student will receive \$1,000 toward college next fall.

Second place in the boy's competition is Kai Oliver from Joseph High School, while third place in the boy's competition went to Cayden DeLury from Joseph High School.

Second place in the girl's competition went to Emily Faulk, from Imbler High School, and third place went to Reagan Bedard, from Enterprise High School.

While the 2nd and 3rd place winners receive no money from the local lodge, they do advance to the District competition for a chance at placing, and receiving monetary awards.

At the District competi-

tion, held in Hood River on January 15, Jacob Evarts was awarded 1st place among the boys. Emily Faulk, despite not being the local 1st place winner, was awarded 2nd place at the District level. Evarts will receive an additional \$1,800, while Faulk will receive \$1,600. Both of these students advanced to the State Contest on February 4, in Newport.

Jacob Evarts placed 4th at state, receiving an additional \$1,500, and will advance to the Grand Lodge (national) contest.

Since Oregon is allotted 17 entries in to the national contest, three additional students, besides the 14 first place district winners, also go on to the national level.

Emily Faulk was one of those three students advancing to the national level. She will also receive an additional \$1,500.

Once at the Grand Lodge competition, each student has a chance to win the top prize of \$50,000 over four years, and is guaranteed an additional \$4,000 for advancing to the highest level of competition. Five hundred students, nationwide, advance to the Grand Lodge level.

Jacob Evarts is the son of Renee Beaudoin and John Evarts. He is an honor student, and excels in cross country and track, as well as music, and is a member of

the National Honor Society. Darby Gasset is the daughter of Stephanie Gasset and Gary Gasset. She is also an honor student, who excels in volleyball, basketball, and softball, as well as FFA, and is a member of the National Honor Society.

Twenty-four high school seniors from Elgin, Imbler, Wallowa, Enterprise, and Joseph competed in this year's Most Valuable Student Competition. Even though Elgin and Imbler are in Union County, they

are closer, geographically, to the Enterprise Elks Lodge than Baker Elks Lodge or Milton-Freewater Elks Lodge.

The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks will have given out more than \$2 million this year, and when you include local lodges and districts, the monetary awards total more than \$3 million dollars. This is accomplished through the Elks National Foundation, which is funded by Elks member donations.

The foundation also funds the Hoop Shoot, Soccer Shoot, as well numerous other scholarships, tailored to family need, interest in vocational programs, and one scholarship that is just for children and grandchildren of Elk members.
