Rotary finishes courthouse gazebo roof replacement

The Wallowa County Courthouse gazebo should last for decades to come now that a new roof has been installed as a project of the Rotary Club of Wallowa County.

The deteriorating, mossy, 40-year- old wood shingle roof on the structure was replaced over the past two weeks with stronger composite material by a crew from Palmer Roofing Co. of Pendleton. Palmer replaced the courthouse roof in a major project last summer.

The gazebo, built by Rotary in 1987 as the “Courthouse Bandstand,” serves as the venue for the Wallowa Music Alliance’s summer Courthouse Concert Series and the opening ceremony of Oregon’s Alpenfest each September. It occasionally has been the setting for weddings.

Rotary raised funds for the project primarily from ticket sales for a raffle of a bull elk hunt landowner preference tag on The Nature Conservancy’s Zumwalt Prairie Reserve last year.

Palmer donated the roofing material and is considering whether to donate some of the labor cost as well, Chuck Anderson, the club’s past president, reported at the club’s meeting last week. Anderson had adopted the roofing job as his “President’s Project” during the 2015-16 Rotary year.

The next phase of the gazebo project is a fresh coat of paint, Anderson said.

Oregon Printmakers Exhibit Comes to Josephy Center

The Josephy Center will host an opening reception on Saturday, April 1, at 7 p.m. for the new exhibit Oregon Printmakers: From the Collection of Christy Wyckoff.

The reception includes a cocktail party and art demonstration stations where visitors can produce their own prints. Josephy Center staff will also distribute vouchers for a post-reception party at the Range Rider in Enterprise.

“The Wyckoff collection includes a variety of methods and artists,” said Cheryl Coughlan, executive director at the Josephy Centers for the Wallowa Arts and Culture. “This will be a chance for visitors to see superb prints and also learn about how they are made. We hope this is step one in creating a print studio for Wallowa County artists who will share a special press and print-making tools.”

For this show, Wyckoff chose several of his own prints as well as those of other collaborators and friends. Wyckoff grew up in Eastern Oregon and spent his summers with grandparents in Wallowa County. He received his master’s of fine arts degree from the University of Washington and taught printmaking at the Pacific NW College of Art in Portland for more than 30 years.

Wyckoff will give a Live & Up Front presentation at the exhibit’s closing reception on May 26. The reception begins at 6:30 p.m. with the presentation at 8 p.m.
