
Wallowa County archer Cole Gomes is soon off to gather a fews more feathers for his own already bristling

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Age is also not necessarily a limitation. The "Dragons in the Wallowas" competitive race team includes individuals older than 70. There are 34 members of the club, 20

of whom will compete in races — and two of those 20 are older than 65.

Anyone older than 14 is invited to try dragon boating. If enough tillers and callers are trained this year, the club hopes to schedule regular times for non-competitors to enjoy paddling on the lake simply as recreation.
