‘Brown bag’ programs will now feature music

Josephy Center has produced a variety of “Brown Bag” lunch programs to explore local history and culture over the past three years.

Going forward, the sessions will feature music.

The plan is to give the Second Tuesday microphone to musicians, according to Rich Wandschneider, spokesman for the center.

Seth Kinzie, who helps organize the program, calls it “The Music Bag.” It will all begin noon Tuesday, May 9, with shape-note singing.

One of America’s oldest folk music traditions, shape-note singing is characterized by raw vocalizations; uncanny, ethereal poetry and sheer volume that has been shaking the frames of primitive wooden churches and of singers themselves for more than



two centuries.

The songbooks — the most popularly of which is “The Sacred Harp” — employ unique notational systems that translate to their idiosyncratic sound, sung in four-part a cappella harmony. Fervently practiced in the South since the 1800s, the modern tradition has now spread to communities across the country and overseas.

Presenter JR Rymut has been fully entrenched in shape-note singing since hearing the 1928 recording of the song “Present Joys.” The Wallowa Valley Music Alliance is hosting twice-monthly sings. The events are free and open to the public. Donations are accepted. Josephy Center is at 403 N. Main St, Joseph.

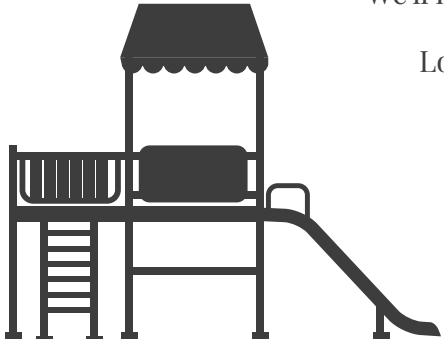
