Wallowa Public Library will host children's author Nancy Coffelt who will share her knowledge of the total eclipse of the sun.

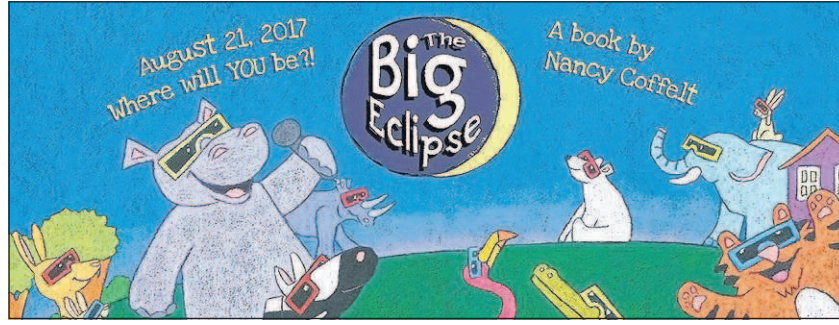

"The eclipse is going to be an amazing spectacle and a fantastic opportunity to engage kids in observational
