100 YEARS AGO
May 5, 1917

The annual spring cleanup for the city has been set by the council to start next Monday. The city will furnish a wagon to gather or collect rubbish. The wagon will be driven along a street or alley, and rubbish collected at the lot or curb line will be loaded on, but the men will have positive instructions not to go inside any lot, otherwise there is no telling where their work will end.

Agricultural Defense Day Three Oregon has been set for Saturday. At these meetings, a crop census of the state will be taken to give the state and federal governments an idea of the probable yield compared with the former years.

At a protracted meeting of the city council Monday night, sidewalks and streets were discussed, and W.R. Nicholson was appointed street commissioner and marshal.

For the first time in Enterprise, the new talking pictures will be shown in the opera house Saturday night. The actors are no longer silent; you hear their voices as they move across the screen. It is a triumph of science, in which performers play their acts before your eyes and at the same time speak their lines, so you see and hear as well as if the living person were before you.
