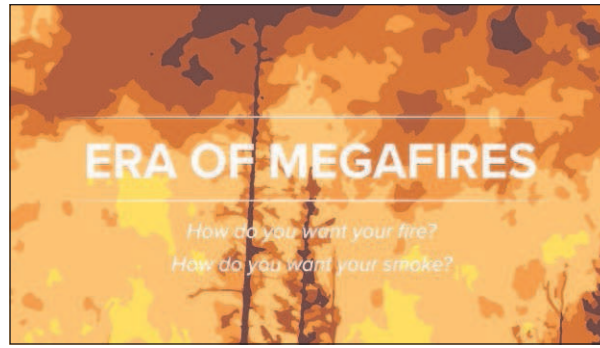

Megafires presentation coming to OK

"The Era of Megafires," a 70-minute multi-media traveling presentation hosted by Dr. Paul Hessburg is coming to the OK Theater in Enterprise 6 p.m. Thursday, May 25.
Hessburg is with the Pacific Northwest Research Station in Wenatchee, Wash., and the University of Washington, Seattle, where he has researched wildfire and landscape ecology for more than 27 years. His presentation comes in the form of fast-moving topic-based talks interspersed with compelling video vignettes. Following Hessburg's presentation, Wallowa Resources will lead a question and answer discussion around topics that are relevant to the community in order to create local actions



and answers to local challenges. Fire management staff from federal, state and local firefighting agencies will contribute to the discussions about fire risk, response and mitigation in the county.
The intent of this project is to significantly reduce the amount of loss from megafires through education, community action and policy change.

Admission to the presentation is free; doors open at 5:30 p.m. Concessions will be available for sale in the lobby.
The event is sponsored by Wallowa Resources, North 40 Productions, the U.S. Forest Service, Oregon Department of Forestry, Oregon State University Extension, The Nature Conservancy and Bruce Dunn of RY Timber of Enterprise.

Denise M. (Butner) Rhodes died May 10, 2017 at Providence St. Mary's Hospital in Walla Walla, Wash., with her family beside her.

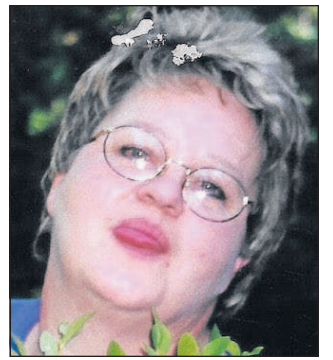
