

Wallowa Lake painting featured in gallery

A painting of Wallowa Lake will be featured prominently in the Abby Aldrich Rockefeller Folk Art Museum’s Collection opening in July 2017 in Williamsburg, Va.

The museum is one of two curated by The Art Museums of Colonial Williamsburg and includes the nation’s premier collection of American folk art, with more than 7,000 folk art objects made during the 18th, 19th and 20th centuries.

“Wallowa Lake,” an oil on canvas by Stephen W. Harley (1863-1947), was painted in Oregon 1927-1928.

Harley, who was born and raised on a Michigan farm, found his artistic expression late in life in the magnificent scenery of the Pacific Northwest, a museum spokesman said. He never married and remained on the Mid-Western farm through both his parents’ lifetimes.

After their deaths, Harley became increasingly restless and hostile to the confining

lifestyle represented by farm life. In the mid ‘20s, he set off to visit relatives in California and to explore the Pacific Northwest.

The landscape there enthralled him, and he made it the subject of four of his five known oil paintings.

According to one biographer, Harley’s siblings had moved out to the burgeoning West Coast many years prior to his visit. Jeffrey Miller surmises their descriptions of the abundant flora and fauna drew Harley westward. However, instead of utilizing his talents Harley spent most of his time exploring, fishing and drinking, Miller says.

“He was a meticulous painter using a magnifying glass to capture the fine detail of his subjects,” Miller said. Other works from his Western adventures include “South End of Hood River Valley.”

On the back of “Wallowa Lake” he wrote, “by S.W. Harley (The Invincible).”
