FFA

GENERAL FFA RULES

(Also refer to 4-H/FFA Livestock Division Rules)

1. All exhibitors shall be paid up members of good standing in a regularly chartered Wallowa County Future Farmers Chapter and shall be enrolled in all day classes in Vocational Agriculture. An FFA Advisor may petition the Fair Board prior to all market animal possession dates if they have a graduated student who may want to participate in the Market Auction program one year beyond high school. Any petitioned FFA member, must show in showmanship. But will not be allowed to advance to All Around
2. FFA exhibitors cannot stay on fairgrounds overnight. Gates lock at 10 PM and open at 5 AM.
3. **All members must show in Showmanship to sell a market animal.**
4. All animals will compete for grand champion within the respective breeds.
5. Classes may be entered as crossbred.
 - a. Partnership animals may be shown when the student owns 25% interest or more in the animal and it is so stated in the project agreement.
 - b. All females must conform to breed type except Crossbred.
6. The 4-H/FFA Memorandum of Understanding will be enforced in Wallowa County.
7. No animal may be shown in more than one class except grand champion, champion, dam and produce, and foundation .
8. In the foundation classes, the male cannot be related to the females. Males must be of breeding age. Foundation classes may also consist of 3 females--only 1 of which can be between 4 and 12 months of age. The others must be older. Beef and Dairy foundation classes shall consist of 2 females and 1 unrelated male. Male shall be at least 12 months old.
9. In market and feeder classes, all breeds compete. All market animals will be weighed in, and classes will be determined by weight.
10. Dairy and Beef cows must have dropped a calf by age of 36 months.
11. In the case of no competition, the premium ribbon will be awarded on its own merit at the discretion of the judge.
12. Special programs or interpretation of rules will be handled by the FFA Stock Show Committee.

13. All exhibits will be judged by the Danish System, and all ribbons and premiums will be awarded by the Danish System. Premiums are as follows for all entries: Blue ribbons, 25 points; red ribbons, 15 points; and white ribbons, 10 points.

14. FFA exhibitor **must** clean out manure in stalls used and place in designated area. **Stalls will be left cleaned following the fair or premium money may be forfeited.**

15. Any intentional damage to either public or private property that can be traced to exhibitors shall be paid out of exhibitor's premium money.

16. Any violation of rules of this book or other correspondence regarding events mentioned herein shall bar exhibitors from exhibiting, entering contests, and obtaining any premium money.

17. The fair management assumes no responsibility for any loss or injury to animals, equipment or exhibits.

18. Only two (2) entries per exhibitor per class, except market animals. Each exhibitor is limited to one market animal that must sell at the auction.

19. Animals cannot be shown in more than one division (Greenhand/Advanced).

20. To compete as a Greenhand, the student must be in their first year of Vo-Ag and not be above the sophomore level.

21. All protests must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$25. The protest must plainly state the cause of complaint and be given to a Fair Board member within 24 hours after cause of the protest. If ruled unjustified, deposit is forfeited.

22. FFA Fair Entry registrations must be turned in to the Fair Office by 12:00 pm, July 12, 2017.

JUDGING**

GENERAL RULES:

Advanced and Greenhand Levels.

1. Individual scoring
50 45 50 35 30 25 20 15 10 5
2. Judging teams of each chapter will consist of three highest individuals from the chapter. Teams to be 5 designated students.
3. Trophy will be presented to winning judging teams.
4. FFA Chapters located outside of Wallowa County are eligible to compete on a 5 member basis with the top 3 counting, but are not eligible for premium money.

FFA HERDSMANSHIP

1. Individual scoring
50 45 40 35 30 25 20 15 10 5
2. Chapter with highest score wins trophy.
3. Herdsmanship Score Card:
 - A. The exhibitor — including:
 1. Appearance neat, clean and properly dressed.
 2. Cooperativeness with fellow exhibitors and those in charge.
 3. Manner, degree and promptness in carrying out duties and responsibilities.
 4. General attitude and conduct.
 - B. Care of Animals
 1. Animals held in pens for best effect
 2. Animal well cared for
 - a. Animal kept clean at all times
 - b. Adequate bedding used

- c. Animals fed/watered regularly
- d. Blankets used properly

C. Care of stalls, pens and aisles

1. Exhibitor card displayed that is fully and neatly completed
2. Equipment kept in show boxes
3. Feed kept in feed aisle and not on top of pen
4. Stalls or pens kept clean and dry
5. Aisles kept clean and free for spectators
