FFA WOOL

1. Two individual entries and/or 1 group of 3 fleeces per exhibitor.
 2. Each fleece must have tag stating breed.
 3. All fleeces will be shown in breed class.
 4. Each fleece shall represent no more than 12 months growth except in case of yearling fleece, when 15 months of growth is allowed.
 5. Ram fleeces will be judged separately.
 6. Fleeces should be tied with fleece twine only. (DO NOT USE PLASTIC--twine or bags)
