Brad will be deeply missed.



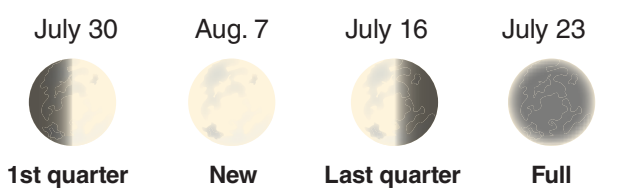
