Concerned Oregonians and Idahoans, including photographer Norton and many small groups banned together to protect this beautiful gorge.

Far-sighted people, including Wallowa County landowner and U.S. Supreme Court Justice William O. Douglas, worked against the Federal Power Commission's

decision to allow the dam's construction.

This eclectic group of people climbed into boats together to float the Snake River and provide their individual perspectives on the wilds and views of Hells Canyon.

"Wilderness and Sublimity: Photography and Conservation Of Hells Canyon" will be open to the public through Sept. 26.
