
BRING YOUR DOG TO WORK

• As busy as everyone has been this summer, you may not have had time to stop at the Terminal Gravity "pop up" food truck on Joseph's Main Street at the old Mutiny Brewing site. The pop up began serving food and beer on the Wednesday of Chief Joseph Days.

TG Marketing guru Kevin Harlander said that TG and the Eastfork Brewery group have decided to keep the pop up going until Eastfork Brewery opens in the locale. He expects that to happen in the fall.

In the meantime, you can't miss the pop up. There's plenty of seating at picnic-style tables with umbrellas to protect you from the sun. The portable kitchen has a "well developed menu for a food truck," Harlander said. You can get a variety of burgers, tacos and salad Wednesdays through the weekend. They're open Friday, Saturday and Sunday 11 a.m. to 9 p.m. and Wednesday and Thursday at 4 p.m. to close.


