Trade show tables are available for \$10. A table and table cloth are provided. There is no fee for sponsoring a dinner table; however, the sponsor handles decorations.

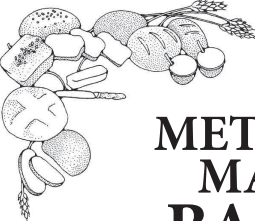

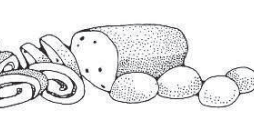
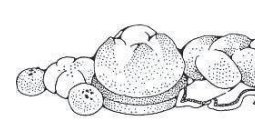
