"It was a low-scoring game, even though we had a 16-point fourth quarter," said Coach Larry Wells. "I felt like our defense was very good. We held Mac High to 40 points which I think is one of their lower productions for the

It was McLoughlin's lowest point total of the year. The school is also a 4A school with a 5-1 record.

Shooting was the weak point with coach Wells noting a performance of less than 30 percent from the floor. He said two of the Outlaws normal high-scorers combined for 2 of 13 shots in the three-point range.

"If it hadn't been for defense, you could see where it could have gotten out of hand," Wells said. "We are traditionally a better shooting team than that. We needed to make our outside shots when they ran their 2-3 zone defense against us. It made for a long night."

Wells said that the team made some fourth-quarter adjustments, which included cranking up the defense and forcing McLoughlin to switch to a man-to-man defense. The Outlaws actually led by four in the final two minutes of the contest and still had a shot in the waning seconds to tie the

"We got fouled on a threepoint shot that put us within one, but we missed the foul shot in the last seconds of the game."


