NOTICE OF ELECTION WALLOWA COUNTY WEED CONTROL DISTRICT

Notice is hereby given that on May 15, 2018, a measure election will be held in Wallowa County, Oregon. The following shall be the ballot title of the measure to be submitted to the voters of Wallowa County on that date:

CAPTION: RENEWAL OF FIVE-YEAR LEVY TO FUND NOXIOUS WEED CONTROL
QUESTION: Shall Wallowa County continue to levy \$0.19 per \$1,000 of assessed value for weed control for five years beginning 2018-2019?
SUMMARY: In 2012, Wallowa County voters approved a 5-year levy to fund a Noxious Weed Control District. This measure will continue that funding for 5 additional years beginning in fiscal year 2018-2019 and running until 2022-2023. An estimated \$160,000 per year would be raised by this measure. This would cost \$19 per year for a home assessed at \$100,000. "The estimated tax cost for this measure is an ESTIMATE ONLY based on past levy funds." Wallowa County is a diverse landscape with valuable resources that are threatened by non-native plants. Since 2017, with the help of Wallowa County tax-payers:
* Approximately 4,311 net acres of weeds were treated
* Approximately \$25,000 of cost share distributed to residents
* A full time vegetation manager coordinates and carries out weed management activities
* Educational programs, brochures, weed tours, school programs, wee-free hay station, and other media
* Levy funds provided leverage to generate and additional \$88,000
Support of this levy will provide for the continuation of these essential services that protect and enhance our natural resource-based economy.

NOTICE OF MEASURE ELECTION WALLOWA COUNTY LIBRARY DISTRICT

Notice is hereby given that on May 15, 2018, a measure election will be held in Wallowa County, Oregon. The following shall be the ballot title of the measure to be submitted to the voters of Wallowa County on that date:

CAPTION: Permanent Tax Rate for Library District
QUESTION: Shall the District be authorized to impose \$0.65 per \$1,000 of assessed value as a permanent rate beginning July 1, 2018?
SUMMARY: If approved, this measure would form the Wallowa County Library District as an independent, public county library service district with a permanent rate dedicated to library services, programs, and materials, effective July 1, 2018. The district would have the powers granted to library districts and public libraries under state and local law. An elected five-member, at-large, District Board would serve as the governing board of the district to provide oversight and accountability. The permanent and dedicated funding source for the library services would be up to \$0.65 per \$1,000 of assessed value. The Library District will include all of Wallowa County except the City of Lostine.

Formation of a Library District would do the following:
• Increase library service hours.
• Retain books, summer reading, student and jobseeker support services, and outreach to children and senior citizens;
• Provide a permanent and dedicated funding source for library services; up to \$0.65 per \$1,000 of assessed value.
• In the first year of imposition, the proposed rate would raise approximately \$490,313.00

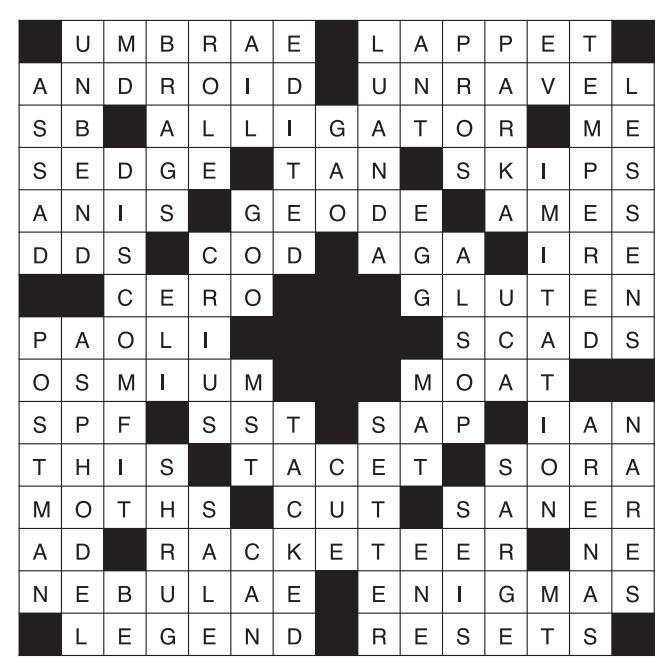

