Ervin Henry Van Blaricom (Van) of Joseph, Oregon, passed away at 96. Van was born in Portland to Clyde and Nellie Van Blaricom. He attended Franklin High School and served in the Civilian Conservation Corps in Oregon and

Alaska after graduation. With the bombing of Pearl Harbor, he immediately joined the Marines and fought in the battles of Midway, Tulagi and Guadalcanal. After he was Van Blaricom injured on Guadalcanal, he
