

Scholarships now available for Music Camps @ Wallowa Lake

In appreciation of 19 years of support from Wallowa County, the board of directors of Music Camps @ Wallowa Lake is pleased to announce two scholarships available to young musicians.

Two Iva Lindsey Scholarships are in honor of Wallowa resident Iva Lindsey who, along with La Grande band teacher Jim Howell and Portland horn artist Larry Johnson, founded Music Camps @ Wallowa Lake with a camp for brass players in 1998.

By popular demand, a camp for woodwind players was added in 2008. One scholarship will be awarded for each camp.

The camps provide students in grade 6 through 12 with small and large ensemble instruction from professional artists who are largely members of the Oregon Symphony Orchestra. All counselors are university music majors; they teach music theory classes, assist the artists and make sure campers have

fun while they learn.

Both camps are held at the Wallowa Lake Methodist Camp, which gives students from all over the Northwest a rare opportunity to improve their music skills in a forested setting. The Flying Arrow Resort and The Wallowa Lake Resort provide lodging for artists at special rates.

The camps also receive local support from The Bronze Antler Bed and Breakfast, Wallowa Lake Resort, The Bank of Eastern

Oregon, Community Bank, Chrisman Development and Management Inc. and from the Wallowa Lake Methodist Camp.

The 2018 camp dates are June 24-30 for brass and July 15-21 for woodwinds. Students interested in attending camp should contact their school's music instructor to obtain an application form. More information about the camps and registration deadlines can be found at musiccampsatwallowalake.com.
