She was born to Lillian and Ernest Smith in Winchendon, Mass., and graduated from high school in 1957.

A year later, she joined the U.S. Army and was enlisted until 1960. After the Army, she thought the Navy would be a better fit and served another 20 years. She retired a Senior Chief Petty Officer.

Michelle Groven, a friend, had a fellow she thought Carol would be interested in and brought her to the fire station where Don Elson was working. Instant sparks. Six months later, they were married on Oct. 26, 1985. Not long after, the couple bought a home in Joseph where she lived for the remainder of her life.

She was dedicated and devoted to helping others and being part of the community. She attended church each Sunday and volunteered whenever she could. Carol also housed foreign exchange students from Japan and Belgium.

Carol was a remarkable cook, wife, grandmother, mother and hostess. She loved to entertain for holidays and other special events.

Don would garden and bring fresh herbs, fruit and vegetables inside for her to use in her recipes. She was envied for her strawberry rhubarb jelly and salsa recipes, among others.

Don was fond of her snickerdoodles. They were a great team as they complemented each other well. They traveled the world together and made many memories.

There are many things Carol will be remembered for, but above all is her commitment to the service, to God and to her family. Her love was unconditional.

She was an outspoken, strong-willed, caring and beautiful person who will be greatly missed. Her sister, Shirley, was able to be with her in her final moments and felt she was finally at peace and comfortable to go home with God.

She is survived by her husband of 33 years, Don; her children: Tori Murphy, Jeff Lemmie, Arlana Elson and Faylene Elson; sister, Shirley and her grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her parents, her brother Chuck and her sister Linda.
