

### 18 athletes from Enterprise going to state competition

nterprise's Hero Peters finished third in the 100 M run at the 2A-6 Wapiti League District Track Finals May 11, despite a person record time of 12.94.

Traditionally a trip to state competition requires a first- or second-place finish. Peters beat the odds.

By virtue of her time, she will represent Enterprise in the 100. It was the highlight of her year.

Peters also ran a leg of the first-place 4x100 Relay team with teammates Dezaria Bathke, Riley Gray and Shelby Moncrief. Brett Greenshields paced with Outlaw boys. He will com-

pete in four events at the state tournament for Enterprise.

Greenshields, who began his season slowly, peaked at "just the right time," according to coach Dan Moody.

Greenshields finished first in the long jump with a personal record 19-07.5 and first in triple jump with yet another personal record 39-09.5.

He also ran a leg of the first-place boys 4x400 Relay with teammates Foster Hobbs, Justus Even and James Marsden and finished second in the 300m Hurdles. He has only run the hurdles a handful of times, Moody said.

## Eagle pole vaulters soar high at districts Dozen athletes

Joseph High School Eagle track teams came away from the 1A-4 District Track Championship in Baker May 11 with many triumphs and a few disappointments.

The boys pole vaulters capped a tremendous season with T J Grote finishing first with an 11-00 leap and William Caldwell second with a jump of 10-06.

Both will make the trip to Eugene for the state track meet this week. Caldwell will also represent the time in the 200 M where he finished second at

Teammate Kade Kilgore, who finished second in district last year, did not make the cut.

Ellyse Tingelstad paced the girls competitors, capturing first in the 1500 M and 3000 M, also making the trip to state in both.

Juston Rogers finished second in the boys 800 M and also ran a leg of the first-place winning boys 4x400 Relay team with Guylen Snyder, Joah Van-Doozer and Tyler Homan.

Homan also placed first in the 300m Hurdles. All four will compete at state.

The Joseph 4x100 Relay team of Sabrina Albee, Camille Crenshaw, Ella Coughlan and Alexis Sykora finished second behind an Adrian team and will head to

Sabrina Albee, Haley Miller, Tinglestad and Coughlan combined efforts to capture second in the 4x400 Relay and a trip to state. Coughlan also finished second in the 400 M.
