Train your brain

Education concept marks first year in Enterprise

Do you have difficulty remembering things? Are you a math illiterate? Do you know of a child who struggles with reading?

Most likely, the problem isn't intelligence. Learning disabilities can impact anyone, young or old.

Overcoming them is the life work of Dr. D.C. Winkelman.

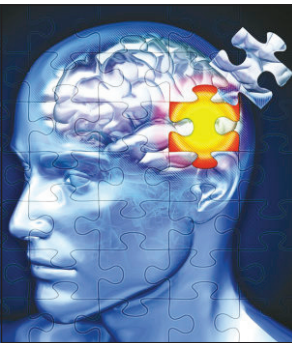
For the past year, he has been bringing his techniques to clients in Enterprise and La Grande through Winkelman's Educational Solutions.

"I have dedicating my life to finding out how the brain works and developing training to allow anyone of any age to learn how to learn," said Winkelman, whose daughter Mary Ellen Russell is educational director for the company.

His work began in earnest in 1964. His career has taken him to far-flung locations around the world, sharing his research to help individuals overcome everything from PTSD to autism.

After many years in retirement, Winkelman found renewed vigor and once again began sharing what he had learned last year. His clientele now is roughly split half adults and half children.

For adults, his expertise can help someone learn more efficiently and earn a promotion. For a child, it can mean the end of frustration and



finding academic success.

"Your success in life is determined by how effectively you use your mental processing skills," said Winkelman. "Processing skills determine how we effective acquire, store and file information in our memory. Last but not least, they determine how effectively we retrieve this information from memory and use it."

Anything that disrupts the process causes stress, which blocks performance.

How does it work? Following testing, the program focuses on helping people understand the various processes of the brain and encourages exercises using the left and right portions in tandem.

"This is how our brains work when an infant is crawling," Winkelman explained. "The brain doesn't work on instinct. If you can get the right and left brain working together, eyesight speech and hearing evolve to the next level."


There's also utilization of what Winkelman calls tactile kinesthetic systems — touch and movement — simultaneously.

Dr. Winkelman, who also holds a master's degree in educational psychology, meets regularly with individuals or families usually for 26 weeks. His Enterprise office is currently located at The Vault.

The program is tailored to be affordable. The fee is the same for one person or the entire family.

"We want to help as many people as possible," Winkelman said. "We're not in this to get wealthy."


