A \$1.25 million state grant paid for renovation of the courthouse safety and electrical, as well as adding an Americans With Disabilities Act elevator. Another \$700,000 was spent on the roof. The elevator has a six-person capacity and is propelled by hydraulic cylinders rather than a cable.

The project began last June. The south parking lot at the courthouse has been closed much of the past year.

The third floor of the building, which had most recently been used for storage, has been turned into offices for Wallowa County Commissioners.

She was a member in the Assistance League of Boise, an all younteer nonprofit philanthronic organization. She especially


all-volunteer nonprofit philanthropic organization. She especially enjoyed using her talents with the Assistance League Thrift Shop near her home in Boise.
