THE WALLOWA COUNTY SUMMER SHUTTLE

May 12, 2018, Enterprise, Oregon, Community Connection announces the most economical way to explore Enterprise, Joseph and Wallowa Lake. That is the Summer Shuttle Bus.

The shuttle will begin on June 1, 2018 and continue until the end of September 2018.

The shuttle runs between Enterprise and the south end of Wallowa Lake. It stops at various locations in Enterprise, Joseph and at Wallowa Lake. Shuttle hours are from 8:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday through Saturday.

A small fee of \$1.50 will get you a ride from one stop to another. An all day pass for \$3.00 and you can ride the bus as many times as you want that day.

The system features route deviation. If you have special needs, we can go off route between stops to accommodate you. To arrange a deviation simply call us in advance at 541-426-3840.

OBITUARIES

Ross Elmo Thompson
April 29, 1934 — Nov. 13, 2017



Ross Thompson of Lewiston, Idaho, was born in Lostine to Clownie and Elma (Butler) Thompson. Ross grew up in Wallowa County, living in the Lostine, Imnaha and Wallowa areas with the family eventually settling outside Flora. He attended Flora High School and served the nation as a U.S. Navy Seabee stationed in the Philippines and Aleutian Islands 1953-1957. He was proud of his service and supported veterans through the Disabled American Veterans, serving as the commander and senior vice commander of DAV’s Lewiston Chapter 18.

He enjoyed spending time with fellow veterans and spoke fondly of the fundraisers, especially their annual fundraiser held on the Lochsa River during Memorial Day weekend. After serving in the military, Ross was employed as a ranch hand throughout eastern Oregon. Later, he was a gyppo logger, followed by employment by Potlatch Forests Inc. as a timber faller based out of Headquarters, Idaho, until his retirement in 1992. He loved his work and took an interest in forest management.

In 1958, he married Elaine Morin Dalglish. With this marriage he gained three stepchildren: Susie Rebman of Midvale, Idaho, Steve Dalglish of White Bird, Idaho and Rhonda Dalglish. They had one child, Joyce Thompson of Baker City, Ore. In 1975, he married Francis Freeman Lombardi of Lewiston. They celebrated their 40th wedding anniversary three years ago. With this marriage he gained three additional stepchildren: Mike Lombardi of Vancouver, Wash., Ken Lombardi of Lewiston and Cherie Lombardi of Fredericksburg, Va. Since 2007, Ross and Fran have been assisting in raising their grandson, Dominic Lombardi, whom they love dearly.

Ross was a kind, giving person who had a lot of love to share. He was loved by many in return and will be sorely missed by his immediate family, his brother, Joe (Susie) Thompson of Lenore, Idaho, along with nieces, nephews and grandchildren.

He especially appreciated his nephews, Ivan (Melody) Thompson, of Craigmont, Idaho, and Jim Thompson, of Step-toe, Wash., and sister-in-law Marge Thompson, of Lewiston, who were great companions and assistance for him.
