Sixty Wallowa Elementary School pupils purchased hundreds of holiday gifts for family members at youngster prices on Sunday, Dec. 16, thanks to Wallowa High School's Interact Club.

The Rotary-sponsored club for students produced its Children's Christmas Bazaar at the school. Interact has staged the bazaar since 2009. First started by the school's Parent-Teacher Organization, the bazaar sells the gifts for pennies on the dollar.

The event was produced by Riley Ferre, Ashlyn Young, Rylee Goller, Shanna Rae Tillery, Kristin Craig, Ella Moeller and Grace Pendarvis, led by Ashley Wilson, the club's president. A visit by Santa

The Interact members were bolstered by other students, parents, teach-

ers and Rotarians. The volunteers set up the bazaar in the school's Beth Johnson Room on Saturday, helped the pupil-customers pick out gifts and wrapped them.

The gift items were solicited by Interactors from businesses in Wallowa and Union counties, including Walmart, Blue Mountain Outfitters, Bella and Ace Hardware, and local residents contributed handmade items.

Interact Clubs guide young people into lives dedicated to community and global service through service projects selected by the club members.

Gift of Art sale nets \$4,800

The numbers are in from the Annual Joseph Center Pre-Christmas "Gift of Art" sale which raised money to support the various Youth Art courses held at the Center.

This year 35 artists donated or partially donated works for the auction and many created works that they could price moderately to appeal to more buyers.

As a result, nearly 80 percent of the artworks sold.

The event raised \$4,800 which helps pay for an after-school art program,

arts for Alternative School students, and the regular youth art courses that serve 75 students.

In all, Executive Director Cheryl Coughlan estimates the Josephy serves 125 students. The auction has historically helped cover art supplies, scholarships and the cost of art instructors.

"We could never charge the craft fee that would cover all the expenses," said Coughlan.

Tickets were also sold on a drawing for a Tom Clevenger wooden segmented bowl, netting \$1,400. Karen Sternadel of Joseph won the bowl.

Half of the proceeds went to Josephy and half went to the OK Theatre New Screen Fund.
