This is their fourth visit to Wallowa County, originally made possible by a local relationship with the Founder, Milton C. Anderson. The first visit was in 2005, with return visits in 2009 and 2016. Over 300 children have participated.

Cost of the workshop is \$59 per student. Scholarships will be available to ensure that every child who wants to participate has the funding to do so.
