The workers had finally finished and were picking up their tools and none too soon because he had heard that the Teacher had arrived in Jerusalem and was going to be in the temple grounds later in the day. He did not want to miss another opportunity to hear him teach. His words were like arrows in his soul. Joseph's heart burned with passion as he listened to Jesus teach the "gospel of the kingdom," as he described it. The things he taught about the Kingdom of God and the resurrection of the dead had long been something he had wondered about; ever since he had first learned them in Sabbath school as a boy. It was what had driven him to excel in his studies. He had done well, had been very


