100 YEARS AGO May 29, 1919

There were 153 applicants for the eighth grade examinations, of whom 54 received diplomas; 28 failed in one subject and 29 failed in two subjects.

70 YEARS AGO May 26, 1949

Seven of the county's 80 odd slot machines are in the custody of the state police following a raid upon two establishments at Joseph Monday. The balance of the machines, which had only a few weeks ago been brought out from hiding and dusted off for renewed play, were quickly gathered up and put back in storage by the own-


