Using these funds the Wallowa County Cultural Trust Coalition (WCCTC) is pleased to announce that \$6,000 dollars in grants for the 2019 season have been awarded to six organizations: Fishtrap, The Josephy Center for Arts & Culture, MidValley Theatre, Nez Perce Wallowa Homeland & Chief Joseph Days' Encampment, Wallowa Mountain Quilters' Guild, and Wallowa Valley Music

The WCCTC founded in 2004 to facilitate funding local projects in arts, heritage and humanities with grant money from the Oregon Cultural Trust. WCCTC grants are typically \$250-\$1,000 and support projects that promote and strengthen Wallowa County culture.


