second time on a Maci Marr steal and layup for a 26-19 edge with 3:15 in the third. After Haley Brockamp's jumper for Wallowa, Kirkland hit two 3s — the second when she rebound her own miss, dribbled back out and connected from deep — for a 32-21 lead with 1:12 in the third.

"We played well in the third quarter," Enterprise head coach Mike Crawford

said. "We had good defense, we finally got ourselves into a spot where we were on the ball defending well, and we opened it up a little bit. (But then) we fell right back into standing around."

The tables turned in the fourth quarter. Kirkland's 3 for the 11-point lead was the last Enterprise points for more than 8 minutes while Wallowa not only got back in the game, but pulled ahead.

Libby Fisher's corner 3 cut the deficit to 32-26 with 6:10 to play. It was nearly two minutes before Wallowa

scored again when Fisher found Zoe Hermens for a layup. Kyla Hook's free throw, Brockamp's layup and a Fisher free throw tied the score with 1:31 left, and Fisher scored again when Hook snagged a steal and found her for a layup and a 34-32 lead with 1:15 to play.

Enterprise's scoring drought ended when Emily Love turned baseline and scored with 52 seconds on the clock, and the teams went to overtime tied at 34-34.

Kirkland opened the overtime with a layup. Wal-

lowa responded on Hermens' layup with 3:30 to go, then took the lead when Brockamp scored off the glass with 1:59 to play. Asiya Salim tied the score for Enterprise, which set up Gray for the winner.

Hook led Wallowa with 11 points, and both Brockamp and Fisher netted eight points.

Enterprise had one final salvo, led by Gray, who finished with a team-high 16 points. Gray hit a jumper to trim the deficit to 45-36 after three quarters, then twice scored on putbacks — the second time with 4:38 to play — to make it a five-point game at 45-40.

Bales ended any of Enter-

prise's comeback hopes with a wild up-and-under layup, then a fastbreak layup to push the lead back to nine, and Fisher followed with a bucket on the low post for a 51-40 lead with 2:36 to go. Enterprise got no closer than nine the rest of the way.
