The celebration continues in the evening with a ticketed gala at the Pendleton Convention Center from 5:30-11 p.m. The evening program will highlight the iconic story of War Paint


with early-day photos and film footage. A buffet dinner followed by guest band Sunday Saloon for music and dancing will cap off the day's events.


