LA GRANDE — The Grande Ronde Symphony will present a "Spring Pops and Concertos"

concert Wednesday, May 25, at McKenzie Theatre on the campus of Eastern Oregon University.

The music begins at 7 p.m.

Alice Trindle, president of the Grande Ronde Symphony Association, said the performance will feature "a delightful mix of classical piano concerto pieces by the winners of the student categories of the 'Concerto + Aria' competition, combined with music from popular movies."

The symphony will be joined by members of the La Grande School District's Fiddle Club, along with the Grande Ronde Student Symphony for the piece "Dragon Slayer" to conclude the first half of the concert.

"This beautiful and challenging piece begins with string accompaniment using pizzicato and builds to a fast tempo with melodic Russian overtones," Trindle said.

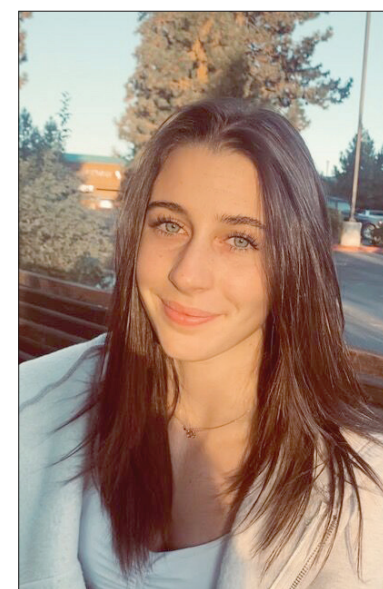


Yena Cho
