

### COAL CONSUMERS IN EAST ALREADY FEEL COAL STRIKE COSTS

Chicago, Oct. 23.—Coal consumers are paying now for a strike which they haven't begun to "enjoy" as yet, according to leaders among the coal miners.

Investigation in central states—the soft coal states—showed prices have advanced in some cities since the miners strike call was issued. In others there had been no change.

A statement by United Mine Workers in Minneapolis said the consumer is forced in some cases to pay \$1 more per ton than a week ago, and that the advance is without justification. Miners, themselves, were hit by the advances, officials of the union said.

In Chicago some dealers advanced prices slightly—four to eight cents per ton. Some of the larger dealers said there was no excuse for an increase now. Chicago has a thirty day supply of soft coal, they said and individual coal bins throughout the city are unusually well filled. A coal shortage last year was a great education toward early buying this season, they said.

At Vincennes, Ind., prices advanced \$1 per ton, it was stated today. Other Indiana cities faced a 50 cent increase. In Milwaukee an "automatic" raise July 1 was the only one hitting the consumers. The Twin Cities reported slight advances.

Iowa operators, dealers said today, boosted prices fifty cents to them, making it necessary to demand 25 cents more from the consumer. The average retail price of soft coal in Des Moines now is \$7 per ton.

### Portland Man Dies In Fall From Dock To Water Below

New York, Oct. 23.—(United Press) on a plank as he climbed over the side of the Portland drydock this morning, I. M. Gingsrich fell into the water and was dead when picked up.

Doctors believe Gingsrich was killed before he hit the water, as his head struck an obstructing timber when he fell.

### MONMOUTH VOTES BONDS.

Monmouth, Or., Oct. 23.—At a special election held Tuesday Monmouth by a vote of 20 to 1 went on record in favor of a gravity water system, voting \$60,000 in bonds to pay for it. The project is to take water from Teal creek, 10 miles away and active work will be commenced at an early date with a view to having the project completed by next summer.

Four amendments also were adopted the most important being the granting of the privilege of raising the city tax limit from 10 to 20 mills.

### VETERAN KILLED BY TRAIN

Roseburg, Or., Oct. 23.—Judson Bowman, 75 years of age, a veteran of the Oregon Indian wars, was instantly killed by a southbound passenger train near Leland, Tuesday. He was walking on the track and failed to hear the approaching train. Bowman was a native of Iowa. He served in company A, 1st Oregon Infantry. A brother, C. O. Bowman, resides at Forest Grove.
