COLGATE RUNS EVEN WITH HARVARD IN EASTERN GRID RACE

New York, Oct. 27.—And still they fall. In fact parachuting from the peak to the dark cave of oblivion has become quite the fad of the season in eastern football circles.

Fans should have been cautioned to Jolly surprises but when Syracuse tumbled from the top Saturday, the informed populace got almost a knock-out.

Washington and Jefferson, the conquerors of the night "O'Neill clan" of New York, was surprised as any one. And no one was more pleased than little Colgate for that giant gust of wind from Pennsylvania removed Syracuse as a title contender and left Colgate alone with Harvard at the top of the ladder.

Next in standing came Pennsylvania the leading point scorer of the east, Dartmouth and Washington and Jefferson. Eastern colleges, conquerors of Yale, went out of the running Saturday when the Army pulled a surprise and turned them Hubbard with the nothing end of a 13 to 0 score.

Strange to say there is no crepe visible around Princeton. Though defeated by Colgate, Princeton showed a lot of power in Saturday's game and proved that neither Yale nor Harvard has much on the Nassau team.

Next Saturday looks to be a general vacation day for all the big eleven. Outside of the Pennsylvania State-Pennsylvania game, none of the eastern leaders look to be in danger.

UNIVERSITY MAKES PLANS TO ENTERTAIN MANY OLD STUDENTS

University of Oregon, Eugene, Oct. 27.—Plans for feeding, housing and entertaining at least 1500 former students and alumni of the University of Oregon Homecoming week-end, November 14 and 15, are now being completed by the large student committee which is in charge of all arrangements. In addition to the alumni about 2000 students are expected from Oregon Agricultural college, although this figure can be only an estimate, and many who are not Oregon's students from all parts of the state.

They are being attracted principally by the annual game with O. A. C. which will be the first game to be played on Oregon's new turf field, which is so constructed that rain or shine it will be the very best of fields for the contest. The grandstand which will seat 4000 is almost completed as are the bleachers which will accommodate 2600. Reservations of seats are being made now through Marion McClain, graduate manager.

So large a crowd is expected for the homecoming luncheon on Saturday noon that both the indoor and outdoor men's gymnasiums will be used. In this way the 4000 or more who will attend the luncheon will be well cared for. A large committee of members of the women's league under the leadership of Jeanette Moss of Grants Pass is planning the luncheon. The booths will be presided over by girls from the various classes. The luncheon is free to everyone on the campus.

AGGIES AND BEARS ELIMINATED FROM CONFERENCE RACE

Corvallis, Or., Oct. 27.—Fast to take advantage of the breaks of the game, although outplayed in the matter of yardage gained and technical football displayed, Stanford University defeated the Oregon Agricultural college eleven here Saturday afternoon, 14 to 6. The results eliminate O. A. C. from the race for the Pacific Coast conference championship.

Berkeley, Cal., Oct. 27.—Washington State college opened the coast conference season here Saturday afternoon by drubbing Coach Andy Smith's grid-iron warriors 14 to 0, and thereby eliminating the Golden Bears from this season's race for football honors. The game was one of the best ever seen on the local field and brands the Washington Staters as strong contenders for collegiate league flag.

Seattle, Wash., Oct. 27.—The University of Washington team waltzed its way through the inferior defense of the Whitman college crew on the local field Saturday afternoon and won 120 to 0.

Corvallis Boasts Kitten Having Six Perfect Toes

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, Or., Oct. 27.—A cat having six well developed toes on a foot was brought into the department of veterinary medicine by Prof. C. S. Brewster of the poultry department. Following an operation Dr. B. T. Simms, professor of veterinary medicine, pronounced the animal normal. Professor Brewster got the cat from W. W. Coons of Corvallis who has a distinct strain of cold-toed cats. With few exceptions all the kittens have six toes. The toes are on the inside of the leg and are as well developed as the others.
