OREGON WIPES OUT WASHINGTON'S HOPE OF LANDING PENNANT

Seattle, Wn., Nov. 3.—Fighting with the determination born of a long series of victories annexed by the purple and gold, "Shy" Huntington's University of Oregon gridiron warriors downed their old rivals, the University of Washington, here Saturday afternoon by the score of 24 to 13.

The game was Oregon's from the outset, the husky Eugene lads wading through and around Coach "Jump" Hunt's line with alarming and consistent frequency. The work of Steers, Oregon's quarterback, and that of Manerude, the midget who succeeded the lemon and yellow pilot when he was forced from the game by injuries, were the big features of the clash.

By Saturday's game Washington is eliminated from the race for first honors in the Pacific Coast Intercollegiate conference and the eyes of football fandom are focused on Portland, where the Eugene lads and Washington State college will fight for the title next Saturday.

O. A. C. Again Beaten

Herkeley, Cal., Nov. 3.—Oregon Agricultural college hit the slide toward the cellar position in the coast conference again Saturday when the University of California eleven took the measure of the northerners here to the tune of 21 to 14. Coach Hargis' lads fought gamely, but were outclassed in every department of the game.

W. S. C. Downs Idaho

Pullman, Wn., Nov. 3.—Continuing its march toward pennant honors of college football on the Pacific coast, Coach Welch's Washington State college warriors Saturday afternoon defeated the University of Idaho eleven 37 to 0, on Rodgers field. Five touchdowns and a drop kick from the 42-yard line chalked up the total. Welch and his squad are confident of a victory over the University of Oregon in the game to be played in Portland Saturday and a large delegation of local fans will accompany the team to the Oregon metropolis.

Aggie Babes Win

Corvallis, Or., Nov. 3.—The Oregon Agricultural college freshman eleven Saturday afternoon defeated the University of Oregon babes here by a score of 3 to 0 in their annual clash.

BASEBALL

Seattle, Wash., Nov. 3.—Seattle's baseball manager will be named at the annual directors meeting of the local club which will be held here Wednesday. Mike Kelley, St. Paul manager in the American association, is the leading candidate today for the post. Kelley is in San Francisco and wants to buy stock, according to Bill Klepper, secretary of the local club, who returned from there yesterday. Charlie Mullen, manager of the Seattle team during the final weeks of the season, wants to buy the club, according to rumors in local baseball circles, but has not confirmed the reports. There are several other candidates for the job, among whom are "Chic" Gandil of Chicago; John Ganzel of Kansas City, and Eddie Herr, manager of Salt Lake last year.

Los Angeles, Cal., Nov. 3.—"Babe" Ruth, who put a ball on the far side of every fence on the American league circuit, met his match at Washington Park, Los Angeles.

In the two games Saturday and Sunday which he played there, the ball refused to go out of the lot, although Ruth got a homer and a two bagger.

Ruth leaves Thursday for San Francisco to play in a series there.

New York, Nov. 1.—New boxing rules to govern the sport in the United States will be discussed Friday night at a meeting of the rules committee of the new International Sporting club. The committee consists of Dr. Joseph E. Rayeroff, Walter Camp, Mayor A. J. Biddle, Warren Barbour, George Dwyer, Charles Tholey, William A. Brady and Tex Rickard.

The French Federation of Boxing invited Major Biddle to attend its conference in Paris December 5 to frame international rules. Major Biddle declined, however, on the grounds that America holds most of the championships and they should come over here.

BEARCATS OUTPLAY AND DEFEAT INDIAN AGGREGATION 28-0

The game was never in doubt from the first quarter, when the "Bearcats" demonstrated their ability to make yardage and Irwin carried the ball over for a touchdown. The teams were almost evenly matched as to weight, though Coach Mathews' men had five pounds to the man advantage. Both teams fought hard and an excellent brand of football was exhibited.

Two touchdowns in the second quarter guaranteed the game to the Methowists early in the quarter. Zeller made a spectacular run of 15 yards which resulted in six points. Although hit three times and knocked from his feet, he carried the ball over. Irwin again carried the ball over for six points, making the touchdown in the last five seconds of the half. The goal was kicked after the whistle. In the third quarter Dimick carried the ball over and kicked the goal. He was successful in kicking goals for all touchdowns.

Chemawa's goal was in constant danger in the last quarter. Poor passing, fumbling and the Indians' defense prevented any scoring. Choats

and Knuckles starred for Chemawa, while Dimick, Tobie and Zeller were the Bearcat stars. At no time in the game were the Indians within 40 yards of the Bearcats goal.
