POSSIBILITY SEEN

London, Nov. 6. - Possible settlement of the Russian situation, which reached a climax during debate in the house of commons late yesterday, was forecast today.

Some leaders saw in the statement of Lieutenant Colonel Cecil Malone that he believed "a possible satisfac-tory peace, with ending of the horrible orgy of death and bloodshed" in Russia might be evolved from prosals made to him by Russian soviet

Malone recently returned from an unofficial mission to Russia, He brought back notes from the soviet government similar to those obtained William Bullit, investigator of the American peace mission. Confidence that agreements made by bolshevik officials with him would make possible peace "with all defacto govern ments to retain control of territory of the blockade against Russia and onhindered transport to soviet terri-tory" was expressed by Malone.
