

### GUILTY AFFINITIES TO REMAIN IN JAIL

Marysville, Cal., Nov. 14. — Mrs. Gertrude Wilson and Frank A. McCormick, her brother, must remain in jail and answer to charges that they murdered Charles A. Brown November 1.

They were held following a preliminary examination, during which letters were introduced indicating Mrs. Wilson, wife of Fred J. Wilson, newspaperman, had been friendly with Brown.

One letter began "Oh, Charlie, you had little devil, what are you thinking about today?" "Please burn this up," the letter said later.

The prosecution asserts it will prove Mrs. Wilson was jealous of the attentions Brown paid to her younger sister, Mrs. O. J. Howard.

### COUNTERFEITERS ARE SENTENCED TO PRISON

Portland, Or., Nov. 14.—Joseph Riley, ringleader of a once active gang of counterfeiters of which six members have been imprisoned, was sentenced to five years at the McNeil Island prison by Federal Judge Wolverton Thursday after he and his wife, Dorothy Riley, had pleaded guilty to sixteen counts involving counterfeiting.

Dorothy Riley will pay the price of transgression under a sentence of ten months in the county jail here. When she heard this her head dropped and

### TONG WAR SCENTED.

### American Shipwreck Crew Rescued At Sea

The Hague, Nov. 14. — A mine sweeper has picked up lifeboats containing thirty eight of the crew of the American steamer Council Bluffs. It was reported here today. The lifeboats were discovered in the North sea, off the north coast of Holland.

The Council Bluffs was a United States shipping board steamer of 1,376 tons. She was last reported to have reached Rotterdam from Philadelphia November 4.

### NEW AUTO COMPANY TO HANDLE POPULAR LINE OF CARS HERE

The first shipment of cars for the new firm are expected to reach Salem Saturday.

### Enforce Prohibition Despite Injunctions

Washington, Nov. 14. — Enforcement of war time prohibition will not be interfered with by injunctions against the act, granted by courts in Rhode Island and Kentucky, it was stated at the internal revenue office today. Appeal of the government to the supreme court makes the injunctions ineffective, it was held.

The supreme court next Thursday will begin hearing arguments as to the constitutionality of the war time act.
