

BISHOP SUMMER IN SALEM IN INTEREST OF DRIVE OF CHURCH

Bishop Walter Taylor Sumner, accompanied by a group of speakers who are making a tour of the Western Oregon diocese, were in Salem last evening in the interests of the rejuvenation drive being conducted by the Episcopal church all over the United States. The objective of the campaign is to bring new members into the church, revive the activity of those already in it, and build new edifices of worship in communities where it is deemed advisable. Salem will no doubt profit by the latter move and the parishioners of St. Paul's church are looking forward to a new building some time in the future. Accompanying Bishop Sumner were Rev. F. B. Fleming, Dr. H. C. Fixott and Rev. H. R. White. A mass meeting was held last evening at which the visitors made addresses bearing upon the subjects to be considered, and conferred with the local committee, of which F. J. Rupert is chairman, concerning the drive which begins next month.

UNION RECORD PRINTS SMALL EDITION DAILY

Seattle, Wash., Nov. 19.—The Seattle Union Record, suppressed last week by order of Attorney General Palmer, following arrest of the editor and managers, is continuing to issue daily a small four page edition, which is sold by volunteer news men on the streets. While the newspaper's plant was closed on charge that it was used for unlawful purposes, officials take the attitude that the paper itself was not suppressed, and that there is no bar to publication elsewhere. The present paper is being issued from temporary quarters in the labor temple.

Indians Seek Title To Muskogee Property

Muskogee, Okla., Nov. 19.—To recover title to one block of land in the heart of the city of Tulsa action has been brought in the interests of the Creek Indians in the United States court here by James C. Davis, trial attorney for the Creeks. The block in question has an estimated value of \$100,000. Forty Tulsa residences are on the block for which the government is asking a court title and possession of the property.

SECOND CLINIC FOR BABIES TO BE HELD HERE ON THURSDAY

The second baby clinic, held under the auspices of the Marion County Children's bureau, will be held in the Commercial club auditorium tomorrow afternoon from 1:30 to 3:30. Hereafter only thirty children will be examined in a day and as more than that number have been entered for tomorrow, some of them will have to be held over until the next clinic. The nurses in charge have not yet been selected but the specialists who will conduct the examinations are as follows: Dentists, Dr. H. H. Olinger and Dr. S. A. Bowman; physicians, Dr. J. H. Fairchild, Dr. Grover C. Bellinger, Dr. E. E. Fisher and Dr. J. Ray Pemberton; eye, ear, nose and throat specialists, Dr. M. C. Findley or Dr. B. L. Steeves and Dr. F. H. Thompson. This work at the last clinic was entirely new to the women conducting it, which caused some unnecessary delay, but this will be done away with tomorrow. Mrs. A. N. Fligel, president of the Oregon Congress of Mothers and Parent-Teachers association, and Mrs. A. Bayley, secretary, will be present at the tests.

AMERICAN CONSUL FORMAL PRISONER MEXICANS DECLARE

Mexico City, Nov. 19.—William O Jenkins, American consular agent at Puebla, arrested for alleged complicity in his own recent kidnaping, is a "formal prisoner," according to a dispatch from that city to the Excelsior today. The newspaper quoted the state judge of Puebla as authority for its statement. According to the dispatch, this is equivalent to an order committing him to jail, although he has neither been imprisoned nor given bond. The present charge against him is making false declarations in regard to the kidnaping. Charges were preferred against Jenkins on the testimony of peons employed on his estate, who declared they saw the American talking with two of the bandits several days before he was held by them for ransom, the supposition being that he was to share with them in the reward for his release.
