

District Attorneys Of Oregon To Convene Here For Session December 11

For three days, beginning December 11, the District Attorneys' association of Oregon will be in session in this city at the auditorium of the Commercial club. Programs for the convention have been completed and invitations sent out to all district attorneys in the state; and it is believed that the attendance at this annual meeting will be greater than ever before. Many matters of importance will be discussed by the legal heads of the counties.

Chief among the topics to be taken up by the district attorneys is the cooperation and coordination of every state officer in every state department for meeting Oregon post-war problems, as they relate to the promotion of true Americanism, the quieting of industrial and social unrest and the curbing of the activities of the reds. These things will be discussed the second day of the convention, at a dinner to be held at the Hotel Marion at six o'clock. The 35 district attorneys of the state, and the attorney general, the governor and the 20 executive officers of the state, the five justices of the supreme court, the 25 circuit judges of the state, all superintendents of all state institutions and the state parole officer, have been invited to attend this dinner.

Prosecuting Attorney Max Gehlhar, of this county, and Circuit Judge George Bingham have important parts in the program. Judge Bingham on the second day will talk on "Divorces and the district attorney." The program for the entire convention follows: December 11—10 a. m. Registration, Salem Commercial club. 1:30 p. m. FUN ORDER OF KNIGHTS TO GATHER AT DALLAS

Dallas, Or., Dec. 3.—On the evening of Saturday, December 13th, one of the biggest nights in lodge-dom ever held in a city in the Willamette valley outside of Portland will be held in Dallas when a class of about 85 tyros will be initiated into the mysteries of the Knights of Khorassan, the fun order of the Knights of Pythias.

The work will be put on by the degree team of Abd-Uh-Atef Temple of Portland of which more than 60 Pythians are now members from this city. A special train bearing the drill team, the Arab band and other members of the order from the metropolis will come to Dallas for that purpose. A big parade will be held in the early part of the evening after which the ceremonies will begin and continue until an early hour in the morning. W. J. H. Clark of Portland, the Imperial Prince, will have charge of the ceremonies and promises "something doing" every moment of the time.

Candidates for the work that night will come to Dallas from Albany, Salem, Independence, McMinnville, Falls City, North Yamhill and Silverton. Large delegations of Dokes will also journey to Dallas to take in the affair and so far word has been received from more than 500 members who intend to attend the ceremonial that night.

A big banquet will be served the knights after the ceremonial and the occasion is to be one of the biggest in lodge circles in recent years.

Bill To Increase Road Tax Limitation Is Filed

With a view to increasing to four per cent of the assessed value of the state, the limit to which the state could be bonded for road purposes an initiative petition involving an amendment to the state constitution was filed here Tuesday with the secretary of state's office by James S. Stewart of Corvallis. The proposed amendment would permit of a bonded indebtedness for highway purposes of approximately forty million dollars on the present assessed valuation of the state.
