### Freedom Of Speech Promised To Faculty By New U. C. Head

Members of the Women's Missionary society of the Presbyterian church will meet Friday at 2 o'clock at the church, High street between Chemeketa and Center, where autos will meet them and they will be taken to the state boys training school. There they will be the guests of Mrs. Levi Gilbert, wife of the superintendent in charge of the institution, and will enjoy a program and general social. Other ladies of the church are invited to go.

Berkely, Cal., Dec. 4.—Freedom of speech and of research for members of the faculty of the University of California was promised by David P. Barrows, newly elected president of the institution, in the first statement he has issued since his election.

"The old, fine tradition of freedom—freedom of teaching, of research, of public activities and of the expression of views will be maintained," said President Barrows. "The only restraint required will be the restraint becoming a gentleman."

President Barrows' statement was given significance by the fact that charges have recently been made that bolshevism had been taught and advocated in the faculty and student body.
