### STEAMER KERWOOD LOST

Washington, Dec. 5.—The American steamer Kerwood, which struck a mine December 1 off Holland, apparently has been lost. An Amsterdam dispatch to the state department today said three lifeboats had been found 10 miles east of the scene of the sinking, except for a few articles of clothing. The dispatch said there was a report the Kerwood sank within an hour after hitting the mine and that the crew was rescued by fishermen and landed at Emden.
