

VERNON O. WOLCOTT, SILVERTON, HONORED

Vernon O. Wolcott, of this city, received his medal from international headquarters of the Y. M. C. A. Tuesday, commemorating the victory of the intermediate section S. O. S. team of basketball champions of Tours, France.

Mr. Wolcott was the only Oregon man thus honored. He was a member of the champion team which played 21 games, touring France and suffering no defeats. The total score showed the champion team 1080 points against 205 for opponents. The finals for championship were played off in Paris at the Palais de Glace last spring. The team was managed and coached by George W. Zahn of Philadelphia, a Y. M. C. A. man and was made up of the following Americans:

Dave Kerr, center, Philadelphia; Bill Reid, forward, graduate of Colward, Philadelphia; Vernon O. Wolcott gate university; Tony Pasquillo, forward, Silvertown, Oregon; Max Flint, forward, Seattle, Washington; Lieut. Friedman, guard, New York; Lieut. Ehlers, guard, Philadelphia; Percy Wilson, guard, Philadelphia.

Vernon Wolcott saw service for 18 months in the 41st division, going over in the old Third Oregon unit. He was one time member of Silvertown's invincible team of '13, playing forward. K. Mount, of this city, was trainer. Mr. Wolcott says the training he received at the hands of Mr. Mount was of inestimable value to him in his overseas playing.—Appeal.

PERSHING LAUNCHES BOOM FOR PRESIDENT

Chicago, Dec. 22—General Pershing left a well defined "Pershing for president" boom under way in Chicago when he departed for St. Louis early today to continue his tour of the country.

The presidential boom was started in connection with the general's two day stay in the city, although apparently he had no connection with it.

Friends opened Pershing headquarters at the Congress hotel and prepared to establish a national organization.

Two hundred thousand letters and other literature were mailed from the headquarters during the last few days. The reception given Pershing by Chicago was characterized as the warmest of the trip by other members of the general's party.

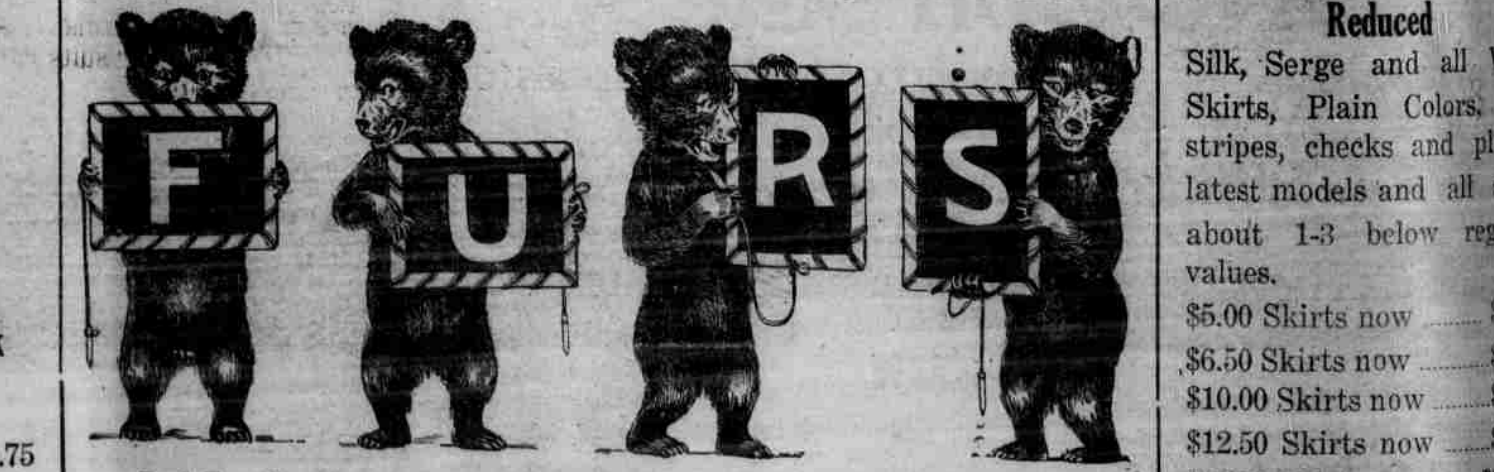
