

INMATES OF STATE INSTITUTIONS TO HAVE A FEAST

Inmates in all of the state institutions will fare sumptuously on Christmas day this year, as they have in the past. Special menus have been arranged by the chefs of the various institutions and the good things are even now in process of preparation.

An idea of the Christmas cheer that will greet the 1744 patients at the state hospital for the insane may be obtained by a perusal of the following summary, prepared by Superintendent Griffith of the institution, as a variety of goodies that will deck the Christmas dinner table at each of the various institutions required to supply the needs of the hospital.

Big Quantities Ordered
Chicken, 200 pounds; turkey, 100 pounds; mashed potatoes 100 gallons; bread 2000 thousand loaves; cranberries, two barrels; giblet gravy, 100 gallons; rice pudding 100 gallons; pickles, one barrel; eggs 300 dozen; tomatoes, two hundred gallons; sweet potatoes, 200 pounds; tea and coffee, 175 gallons; raisin ginger bread, seven hundred pounds; cider, 100 gallons; apples, forty boxes; candy, 375 pounds; roasted peanuts, 600 pounds; walnuts, 175 pounds; almonds, 140 pounds; filberts 140 pounds; pop corn, seven barrels.
Prison Fare Good
Roast turkey with veal dressing will feature the menu at the state prison, supplementing which there will be an abundance of the following edibles: green olives, celery, salad, mayonaise dressing, brown gravy, cranberry sauce, pineapple fritters, sugar sauce, mashed potatoes, English plum pudding, raspberry sauce, mince pie and jelly roll.
Aside from this each inmate of the prison will be remembered by the Salvation army which has ready for distribution Wednesday evening baskets laden with good things to eat.

RATIFICATION FAVORED BY 203 OF 216 BALLOTS

A total of 216 ballots on the ratification of the peace treaty have been cast by readers of the Capital Journal in the first 10 days of voting. Of these 203 favor ratification of the treaty in some form and 13 are opposed to its ratification.

Sixty five favor compromise on reservations with immediate ratification. Four favor ratification with the Lodge reservations. 134 favor ratification without reservations and 9 oppose ratification in any form.

The balloting will continue and all readers are urged to vote, in order to force action by the senate. The ballots will be sent to Washington, as part of a nation wide referendum conducted thru the newspapers at the instance of former president Taft.

Vienna's Christmas Scant Beside Previous Seasons

Paris, Dec. 24.—Vienna's Christmas will be a pitiful skeleton of the celebration in pre-war years. Food Controller Loewenfeld, who is in Paris, said today. The Austrian people have more yuletide traditions than any other. Loewenfeld said, but this year the coal shortage has made necessary a regulation allowing only one room in each home to be heated and lighted.

There is also a shortage of tallow with which to make candles. Christmas trees are costly, a small one bringing 50 crowns.
