Firm in the belief that the 'Oregon spirit' will not fail you in the crucial test for supremacy between the east and west the whole state as well as your alma mater will be with you either in spirit or in person on Thursday. Through you we are certain national recognition must be given to the athletic prowess of the west. EX-SERVICE MEN FILE DISCHARGE PAPERS IN COUNTY'S VAULTS

"We're on our way to Heligoland, to get the kaiser's goat," they sang two years ago and although some of them did not get to Heligoland, the kaiser is now searching for his angora in Holland, while Salem's service men have returned and are getting back into the old game. Before discarding all memoirs of the service, the first precaution taken by the veterans is to make sure that that documents of documents: that discharge certificate is not lost. Many Marion county men have decided that the best way to prevent loss of the vital certificate is to file it at the office of the county recorder. So County Recorder Mildred Robertson Brooks finds these items added to the already voluminous business of her office are many.

This week's collection of service records gives a partial story of war participation of the following:

Claire L. Ogle, 2nd lieutenant, enlisted in the service, May 24, 1917, and received his commission August 28, 1918, service in the United States. Knute E. Burtmess, 32, mechanic, company K, 182nd infantry, was originally a member of company K, Oregon National Guard, but his organization was federalized August 5, 1917. Burtmess served in France, December 11, 1917, to August 17, 1919, receiving his release from the service, October 6, 1919. Pvt. John A. Reinhardt, 26, United States marine corps, enlisted May 6, 1918, and served in the United States, being discharged from the service March 21, 1919.

Pvt. Robert Lovern Patterson, 28, United States marine corps, enlisted May 4, 1918, and served in the United States being released May 20, 1919. Corporal Ralph P. Shepard, 20, company B, 76th infantry, enlisted May 11, 1917, but did not achieve his wish, to get overseas. Corporal Shepard received his release from the service, January 27, 1919. Private first class Lee C. Douglas, ordnance corps, entered the service May 12, 1918, and served in France, August 31, 1918, to July 19, 1919.

INCORPORATIONS.

Supplementary articles of incorporation were filed by the Willamette Navigation company of Portland.

Increases in capital stock are shown in certificates filed by the Island Lumber company, St. Helens, from \$50,000 to \$150,000 and the John Clark Saddlery Co., Portland, from \$50,000 to \$250,000.

EUROPE UNABLE TO SUPPLY MORE PAPER

New York, Dec. 31.—America can expect no relief from Europe in the shortage of newsprint paper in the belief of Philip T. Dodge, president of the International Paper company, expressed to the Dow Jones financial news agency today.

Dodge has just returned from an extensive tour of Europe, where he investigated conditions.

"Before the war the chief factor which enabled European countries to ship newsprint to this country profitably was the cheap cost of labor," Dodge said. "I believe these are things of the past."

"As a result of existing conditions," Dodge said, "I do not look for any recession in newsprint prices for two or three years, if then."

COMPERS EXPECTED TO OUTLINE LABOR'S SETTLEMENT PLANS

Washington, Dec. 31.—Labor, speaking through Samuel Compers, within the next few days is expected to submit to President Wilson's industrial commission a list of proposed changes in the tentative plan for settling capital-labor difficulties.

The commissioners invite such action and would like to have reports of capital also in the form of proposals. Labor probably will suggest more specific recognition of collective bargaining, flat recognition of trades unions, elimination of anything that could be construed as limiting the right to strike or compelling men to work against the will and also will recommend that government agencies be set up to study and improve working conditions.

Secretary Wilson, chairman of the conference, heard with interest the average comment of Compers and Frank Morrison, secretary of the American Federation of Labor. "We welcome all constructive criticism," he said.

"Criticism is what the commission asked for," another official declared. "It will all be considered when the commission reconvenes January 12."

State Departments Reach Agreement On Jurisdiction

Members of the state labor bureau and the state fire marshal's office met here in conference, Tuesday, relative to the jurisdiction of each department in connection with the inspection of electrical equipment over which there has been some confusion. A satisfactory understanding between the departments, eliminating the duplication of effort which has existed in the past is said to have been reached as a result of the meeting.
