

ARMISTICE TERMS INDICATE VICTORY GOES TO ESTHONIA

London, Thursday, Jan. 1.—Study of the armistice signed by Esthonian and Bolshevik representatives last night preliminary to an armistice, particularly the military guarantees indicating the Esthonian have secured a notable success. The biggest surprise was that the Esthonian would not be required to elect soldiers who fought under General Yudenitch in his recent campaign against Petrograd until after ratification of the treaty.

Weapons Also Forfeited.
The military guarantees prohibit the presence on the territory of either Soviet Russia or Esthonia of any arms other than their own or with limited powers with which one of the contracting parties has concluded a military convention, but which is not actually working against the other. Recruiting and organizing armies of other states and organizations hostile to either side is prohibited.

It is provided that all troops not under the authority of either government on January 1 shall be disbanded and that all army and navy munitions and stores excepting food stuffs and clothing belonging to such forces shall be neutralized and immobilized until January 1, 1921. Thirty per cent of such disarmament and neutralization of stores of non-government armies must be completed within seven days after the ratification of the peace treaty and 33 per cent of the remainder must be completed each week following ratification.

Recruiting Restricted.

Soldiers and officers in non-governmental armies may not enter the armies of either of the contracting parties with the exception that men of Esthonian nationality may enter the Esthonian army. Use of ports in either Esthonia or Soviet Russia is forbidden for the transport of goods which may be used against the other. The agreement stipulates that organizations may not be formed in either Esthonia or Soviet Russia under the pretense that such organization is the government of either party. In case there is international neutralization of the Gulf of Finland both parties agree to join the convention.

Daughter Of President Of Brazil Honored By Queen

Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, Dec. 3.—Mrs. Laurita Pessoa, daughter of the president of Brazil, has just received from Queen Elizabeth of the Belgians a brooch of pearls and brilliants with the monograms of King Albert and Queen Elizabeth in gold and sapphires. The whole surmounted by a small royal crown of silver and brilliants. In a letter accompanying the present the queen manifests the hope of seeing Miss Pessoa again next year. Miss Pessoa is 18 years old.

IRISH EDUCATION BILL AS FRAMED BY LEADERS DISLIKED

Dublin, by mail, Dec. 18.—The government's Irish education bill is criticized here on the ground that the Irish educational system should be framed by an Irish Parliament.

The Home Rule Bill was expected to grant separate treatment for Ulster, but the education bill is framed on the assumption that Ireland is a single unit. The education bill sets up only one central authority in Dublin directly responsible to the Imperial Parliament.

It introduces for the first time into the educational system of Ireland a local school tax. Hitherto all the money has been found by the treasury, supplemented by voluntary subscriptions. There will be popular representation on the school board but its function is to be advisory only, and the power is all to rest with the new education department. This will consist of the Chief Secretary and the Vice President of the Department of Technical Education, both of whom come into and go out of office with the British ministry of the day, and of a permanent member who will be the real administrator of the new system.

Religious controversy is avoided by the provision in the bill continuing the existing plan by which the school manager, mostly the clergy of the various denominations, appoint the teachers and control the schools.

Market Opens With Climb In Stocks Still Going

New York, Jan. 2.—Wall street, 10:30 a. m.—On the stock exchange the New Year opened with a continuance of the advance which marked the final session of 1919. Poole resumed their activities in many popular issues notably specialties, American Woolen again leading at an initial gain of 3 points.

Steele, motors, oils and equipments also were heavily traded in, advancing one to 2 1/2 points with standard and secondary rails. United States Rubber, Central Leather, Industrial Alcohol, International Paper, American International and Ohio Copper were included among the strong features of the first half hour.
