

AMERICAN CAPITAL LOOKS TO FINANCING FOREIGN COMMERCE

New York, Jan. 3.—In the financial district the passing of the old year and advent of the new was attended by pronounced improvement of sentiment, this feeling being shared by the most conservative interests.

The long sustained money loan and the speculative outlook are being substituted to such important securities as the financing of foreign trade and restoration of a sound industrial condition.

BOXING

New York, Jan. 3.—Boxing enthusiasts today had their attention directed temporarily from the proposed Carpenter-Dempsey bout by reports that Jack Britton, welterweight champion of America, would meet the winner of the bout between Kid Lewis and Johnny Busham for the English title this month.

English promoters have offered Britton \$17,500 to box in London in March. Britton was said to have received an offer of \$20,000 from C. H. Corbridge, English promoter now in this country to see the winner of the Lewis-Busham affair.

CENSUS ENUMERATORS COMMENCE BIG TASK

Census enumerators of Marion county will set forth Friday morning when the taking of the fourteenth decennial census begins. For the county, 23 census takers have been appointed, there being 12 for Salem and 11 for outside towns and rural districts.

The actual taking of the census will require about two weeks. Enumerators are provided with two regular information forms and a supplement at schedule. The census sheet and the form information schedule are supplemented by a special sheet upon which data pertaining to deaf mutes and to the blind is entered.

Shipping Board To Sell 30 Former German Ships

Washington, Jan. 3.—The shipping board has offered for sale to American buyers thirty former German ships, including the gigantic Leviathan, the George Washington, the Agamemnon and other well known passenger and cargo vessels.

Eight New York State Newspapers Raise Prices

Albany, N. Y., Jan. 3.—Albany's two morning newspapers, the Knickerbocker Press and the Argus announced today that on Monday the price of daily papers would be increased from two to three cents.

DALLAS BASKETBALL QUINTET WINS OVER ROSEBURG TOSSERS

The Roseburg basketball team, composed of some of the fastest players in the southern part of the state went down to defeat Thursday night at the hands of the American Legion team of Dallas by a score of 26 to 18. The game was fast from beginning until the whistle sounded the end, both sides playing so rapidly that it was hard for the spectators to tell at times who was in possession of the ball.

Wednesday night the Legion team defeated a fast team composed of Independence players by a 21 to 23 score. This year's Independence team is the strongest ever organized in that city and a real game may be played with them at some future date.

He confessed, however, to a robbery in one of the logging camps of the Valley & Siletz railway company which occurred some time ago.

Dallas, Or., Jan. 3.—Mrs. Ida M. Callahan of Corvallis, state president of the Federation of Women's clubs will pay the holiday women's club an official visit on Tuesday, January 6. Mrs. Callahan is the first state officer of the organization to visit the local organization for years and special programs have been prepared for her coming.

1159 Ships Made During 1919 For U. S.; Tonnage 669,323

Washington, Jan. 3.—Vessels constructed for the shipping board during 1919 numbered 1159 totaling 669,323 deadweight tons, it was announced today by the board. Of this number there were 741 steel, 120 iron, 453 wood and three concrete ships.

Chinese Laborers Stage Play for French Orphans

Paris, Jan. 3.—Chinese contract laborers brought here during the war have given a play in the Nirol theatre for the benefit of French War orphans. Most of the men were illiterate when they came to work behind the fighting front. They learned to read their own language and are making progress in French under Y. M. C. A. instruction.

Square Dealing by Japan With Koreans Is Advocated

Tokyo, Jan. 3.—Dr. Mizuno, director of administrative affairs of the Korean government-general told the Seishukai party the other day that to regard the Koreans as uncivilized and ignorant people and merely bring pressure upon them as such for administrative purposes was by no means a timely policy adapted to the existing state of affairs. It was of vital importance, he said, to treat the Koreans with kindness and benevolence and guide them to progress development.

Czech Social Democrats Organize Strong

Prague, Jan. 3.—The Czech Democratic party has organized a bank here with a capital of 100 crowns. It will finance all the cooperative stores and other enterprises and guide them to progress development.
