

RATIFICATION OF SUFFRAGE IS NOW NEARLY COMPLETE

Oregon's ratification of the woman suffrage amendment to the federal constitution is now complete except only for the signatures of President Vinton and Speaker Jones.

BILL WOULD MAKE REAL ESTATE AGENTS OF COUNTY CLERKS

J. B. Ziger of Tualatin has prepared a bill whose introduction he seeks into reality brokers for the convenience of the public, which would list property for sale for a nominal fee.

Be it enacted for the purpose of facilitating the transfer of real property with economy, the clerks of the several counties of the state shall keep a sales book.

The owner of any real property in the county desiring to sell may upon payment of a fee of not more than 50 cent per page have entered therein his offer, specifying price, and all essential details of his proprietorship, and such description as he desires.

He shall be bound to the county by his offer, if accepted by a purchaser, making a guaranty deposit with the clerk of one per cent of the price named, in a similar sum of one per cent, which shall be forfeited in case of his failure to consummate the deal.

H. B. 34, by Mrs. Thompson—Levying an annual tax of two mills for public elementary school and providing for the disbursement thereof.
