

### FARMERS ASKED TO PREPARE FOR CORN DISPLAY THIS WEEK

Farmers who wish to participate in the sixth annual Marion county corn show are urged, in a statement made Monday by Luther J. Chapin, head of the show, to prepare and send in their exhibits at once. The corn show opens officially at 10 o'clock Thursday morning at the Valley Motor company's tractor department, State and Front streets, Salem.

The date for the corn show has been postponed several times because of the inclement weather in late December. The fair weather forecast for this week, however, is expected to bring many exhibitors to the city. Tables on which to place the exhibits were being arranged at the building Monday.

Lectures on tractor operation and care will be given, starting at 10:30 Friday. Because of the extensive use of these "mechanical horses" on farms in the county numerous persons are expected to be on hand to hear the educational talks.

Mr. Chapin said Monday that he believes, from information gleaned throughout the county, that the corn to be exhibited at this show will excel any heretofore produced.

Prizes, contributed from all banks but one in the county, have been arranged for the best exhibits of corn. These prizes run higher than ever before, and add incentive to the exhibition of corn.

Another feature of the corn show will be the boys and girls corn judging contests that will be held Saturday. Prizes are offered for this.

### PLANS FOR SHIPYARD INVESTIGATION MADE

Seattle, Wash., Jan. 19.—Conference regarding submission of evidence concerning alleged frauds by Washington shipyard owners before a federal grand jury which meets here Wednesday were held here today by Bert Schlessinger, San Francisco attorney, William Tidwell, special agent of the treasury department of W. C. Foster, special agent of the department of justice.

Schlessinger and Tidwell arrived last night. Foster has been here for two months checking shipyard accounts.

Announcement was made in San Francisco last week that officials believed shipyard owners of Oregon, Washington and California had defrauded the government of several million dollars in handling the ship plants on coast plus contracts. Mr. Schlessinger declined today to name any corporation that is being investigated.

### MARTENS IS CALLED FIRST BY COMMITTEE

Washington, Jan. 19.—Ludwig C. A. K. Martens, self-styled Russian soviet ambassador to the United States, was the first on the list of witnesses to be heard today at the opening of the senate foreign relations sub-committee's investigation into Russian bolshevik propaganda in this country. His personal secretary and "chief of staff" Gregory Weinstein, who was one of those recently arrested in the department of justice roundup of alleged radicals, and Santeri Nuorteva, secretary of the soviet bureau, were expected to follow Martens on the stand.

Weinstein recently was released on bail from Ellis Island where he was awaiting a deportation hearing. A warrant also is said to have been issued for the arrest of Martens but its execution was held in abeyance pending his appearance before the investigating committee.

### SIX CLUB LEAGUE FOR NORTHWEST PLANNED

Seattle, Wash., Jan. 19.—Definite plans are to be made at a meeting next Sunday for the organization of a six club class B baseball league to cover the territory of the old Northwest league. John Barnes, Seattle baseball man and Robert Brown, Vancouver, B. C., club owned announced here today.

Five cities, Portland, Seattle, Tacoma, Vancouver, Spokane and Yakima, are certain of places in the league, Barnes and Brown said. The sixth club will be from Wenatchee, Bellingham or Victoria, B. C.

The new league, it is hoped, will become a "farm" for the Pacific coast league. Seattle probably will have continuous baseball during the summer as the new organization plans games here when the Pacific coast league team is on the road.

### Ellensburg "Wobblies" To Be Sentenced This Week

Ellensburg, Wash., Jan. 19.—Sentence will be pronounced here this week upon six alleged Industrial Workers of the World found guilty here yesterday of being members of an organization "organized for the purpose of effecting economic, political and industrial changes by means of intimidation and violence." The men were arrested in November in Cle Elum, a coal mining town near here.
