

BOARD TO DISCUSS SMALLPOX SITUATION

Having assembled sufficient members to give a quorum, the Salem school board plans to meet in offices of City School Superintendent J. W. Todd.

The most important business to be considered by the board at this special session will be consideration of the quarantine and vaccination situation in Salem, the state board of health having recently issued warnings that the increasing number of smallpox cases made rigid measures necessary.

Investigation will be made of conditions in Salem and it is probable that the state health authorities will require that all attendants at Salem schools be vaccinated or be restrained from attendance.

Since the health boards warning was issued, many school children have come to physicians' offices for vaccination. Another cause for the noted interest in this matter is the fact that there are ten cases of smallpox in this city at the present time.

City and county health officials report that cases are in thorough quarantine and that there is no cause for undue alarm. It is generally conceded, however, that vaccination furnishes the best protection against the disease, especially in these days of crowded school rooms and also places of amuse ment. The numerous cases in Portland are all among individuals who had not availed themselves of active immunization and is said to have been aggravated by the increasing tendency of city dwellers to gather in crowded halls and other places.

Majority Must Consent To Land Dissolution, Opinion

The signatures of a majority of the bona fide owners of land in an irrigation district is necessary to a dissolution of such a district, according to an opinion written by Attorney General George M. Brown for the guidance of T. S. McKinney, district attorney for Lake county. In his request for the opinion McKinney stated that the question was up before a district which included some 1600 land owners scattered throughout the United States.

Brown's opinion holds that the approval of a majority of the land owners must be had before the board of directors of an irrigation district can move toward the dissolution of the district regardless of whether the owners hold ten or 100 acres. Although admitting that the provision might work a hardship on some irrigation district Brown points out that it is a state law and can only be remedied by legislative action.

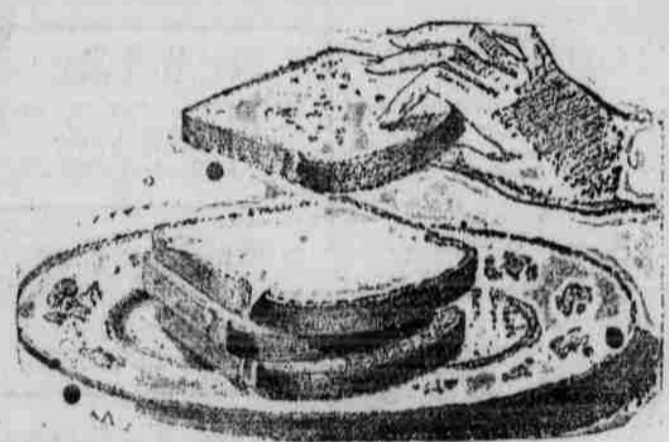
