

PREMIER DUROCS AT FAIRGROUNDS SALE AND SHOW

A show and sale of Duroc swine will be held at the Oregon state fair grounds, Wednesday, February 4. The exhibition and sale will be held under the auspices of the Oregon Duroc Jersey Breeders association.

The exhibit and sale will be of sows and gilts only, representative of the best blooded stock of the Pacific northwest. The sale is of especial interest to Oregon swine growers because of the actual shortage of brood sows in the northwest. Judging will start at 9:30 Wednesday morning, G. M. Harvey of Boyd, Oregon, being judge of the showings. Sales will begin at 1 p. m. and will be in charge of Col. J. W. Hughes of Forest Grove and George E. Satterlee of Salem.

The event will be preceded by a banquet given Tuesday night. At this time, the United States National bank of Salem will be host to the visiting buyers and consignors, of whom about 50 outside men are expected. No banquet was incorporated in tentative plans for the show, but the bank officials decided to give a demonstration of genuine Salem hospitality. The banquet place has not been designated, but will be held either at the Marion hotel or at the Spa.

Interesting addresses are planned for the Tuesday night festivities. G. A. Pierson, president of the Union Stockyards of Portland will speak upon "The depletion of brook stock in the northwest." Luther Chapin, Salem, "Hog raising in the Willamette valley." G. W. Eyre, vice president of the United States National bank, will depict "The hog as a mortgage lifter, and friend to the farmer." Following the round table talk, the assemblage will be the guests of the Salem Commercial club at the Oregon theater. At the end of the late show, the stockmen will view special films taken recently at the national swine show at Chicago.

On Wednesday, lunch will be served at the fair grounds by the Ladies Aid society of the Leslie Methodist church, Salem.

HOLT WILL LEAVE TO TAKE NEW POST SOON

Next Sunday will be the closing day of the pastorate of Dr. G. F. Holt at the First Baptist church. Dr. Holt has resigned his place here and accompanied by his family, leaves Tuesday for Seattle where he has accepted the position of director of promotion for the West-Washington Baptist convention.

Dr. Holt came to Salem in March, 1916, and during his pastorate here the church has prospered greatly. New members to the number of 327 have been received, bringing the church membership up to 717.

1920, approximately \$25,000 will have been raised and expended by the church in the following manner: \$8,300 for missions and benevolences; \$1400 for indebtedness; \$1800 for improvements and about \$12,000 for current expenses. The First Baptist church is now practically out of debt. Dr. Holt has been interested in all of the welfare work of the city. He is a member of the Commercial club, the Y. M. C. A., the Salem Ministerial association and the Red Cross. He took an active part in many of the drives during war time and his mes-

sages always had the ring of patriotism.

He has also given consideration to denominational work, for two years being vice president of the board of directors of the Oregon Baptist convention, a member of the trustee board of McMinnville college and on the general board of promotion for the Northern Baptist convention.

Members of his church and many friends regret the departure of Dr. Holt family. Mrs. Holt has always worked incessantly in promoting her portion of church activities. George F. Holt, Jr., and Lucy M. Holt, son and daughter of the resigning pastor, have formed an extensive circle of friends during their residence in Salem. Miss Holt is a sophomore at Willamette university, while George, Jr., is a member of the W. U. freshman class.

Saturday noon, Dr. and Mrs. Holt were the guests at a luncheon at the Spa, given in their honor by the Salem Ministerial association. Monday evening the church gives a farewell reception to Dr. Holt and his family. This will also be a reception to the 60 or more new members of the church, whom have been received during the past month. All friends of the family are cordially invited.

Water Permits.

Frank F. Lischke of Milwaukee, who only recently filed with State Engineer Copper application for water rights covering several power sites on streams in central Oregon, today filed additional applications covering appropriation of water for power purposes at the Moody, Lockit, Sluamox, Oak Grove, Sherer Falls, Oak Springs and Maupin power sites on the Deschutes river. None of the applications, however, have been completed.

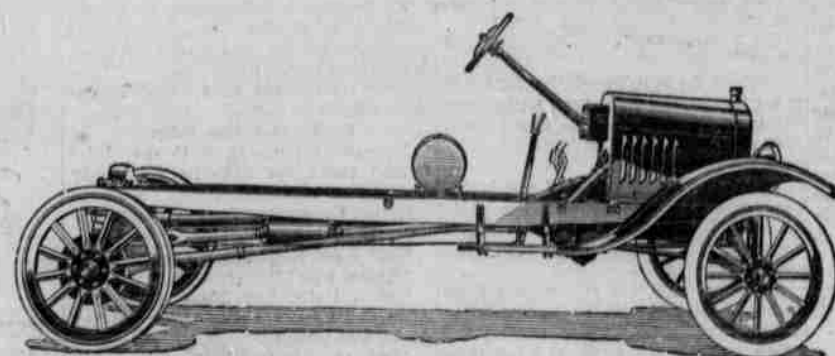
